38% Not very good



Current Reality

- Each ISD is virtually a sovereign nation
- Student funding is roughly \$11,000 per student,
 +/- \$250,000 per classroom
- Median teacher salary is +/- \$47,000
- ISD's have few limitations from the state
- Collective bargaining is illegal
- ISD's can charter all they want, even the entire district

- If status quo continues, radical legislative reform will be the result


How it Can Happen
